3.0	<u>COMPACT QUESTIONNAIRE</u>	
	The group discussed the purpose, outcomes and use of the proposed Compact survey and its results. It was agreed to develop two individual questionnaires – one for VCS organisations and one for the public sector signatories PB to develop the VCS questionnaire KW to develop the LA questionnaire Consultation with the working group would take place via e-mail. It was hoped the questionnaire could still be released for the end of May so that data could be collected and analysed in time for the NYSP partnership meeting in October. It was agreed NYFVO would act as the ‘postbox’ for replies. The consultation would be made available online through the NYSP and partner websites CVSs (15) would be asked to distribute JW to seek funding from NYCC in respect of the associated costs – KW advised that for a mailing of this size Harrogate CVS usually charged approximately £60 – a total of	PB KW WG WG NI ALL JW
