**Education Training and Employment Performance July – September
2009 for those of Statutory School Age**

1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 1.1 To outline and analyse the educational provision offered to all those of statutory school age where Final Warnings / Intervention Orders, with the Youth Justice Service (YJS), ended between July and September 2009.
- 1.2 To analyse the attendance of each young person of statutory school age whose orders ended between July and September 2009.
- 1.3 To clarify reasons for individuals not accessing 25 hours Education Training and Employment (ETE) provision and make recommendations to improve practice.

2.0 BACKGROUND

- 2.1 National Indicator 45 relates to young people supervised by the YJS attending suitable full-time ETE. The target for 2009 – 2010 is 60% having risen from 56% for 2008 – 2009.
- 2.2 Performance from 1 April 2008 – 31 March 2009 indicated 56.3% of all young people (statutory school age and those above statutory school age) who ended an Order / Intervention, supervised by the YJS, were in full time ETE. 52.8% being the number attending ETE of statutory school age.
- 2.3 Performance from 1st April 2009 to 31st July 2009 indicated 58.6% of all young people who ended an order/intervention were attending full-time ETE. 54.4% being the number attending ETE of statutory school age.

3.0 PERFORMANCE: JULY – SEPTEMBER 2009

- 3.1 63.5% of those post compulsory school age whose Orders ended, were engaged in full time ETE in the quarter July – September 2009.
- 3.2 54.37% of those of compulsory school age whose Orders / Interventions ended were engaged in full time ETE in the quarter July – September 2009.

- 3.3 A total of 103 Orders ended during July – September 2009 for those of statutory school age. 58 out of the 103 Orders indicated full time ETE of 25 hours or more. A full list of the provision and school where this full time provision was accessed is shown in Appendix A.
- 3.4 5 of the young people had more than one Intervention/Order ending during the quarter, these 5 individuals were not in full time ETE at the end of either order.
- 3.5 The 45 orders where individuals did not access full time ETE (25 hours) are shown in Appendices B and C. The Actual hours accessed are shown along with the school they were on the roll of. There is also a commentary to outline: more background information that may have influenced weak attendance; the actual hours accessed and clarification if full time ETE was offered but not accessed.
- 3.6 The breakdown of the 45 Orders where full time ETE was not accessed is

It is disappointing to note the number of young people whose Orders ended who accessed either no provision or less than 4 hours provision that week. A breakdown commentary of the 14 cases (12 individuals) is shown in Appendix D.

- 3.7 Out of the 45 cases where full time provision was not accessed, 21 were only offered part time provision the remaining 24 were offered full time.
- 4.0 **RECOMMENDATIONS**
- 4.1 The analysis and recommendations of this report to be shared with the designated teachers for the YJS in mainstream Secondary Schools, North Yorkshire Special Schools and Pupil Referral Services.
- 4.2 The Head teacher ELAC Virtual School and Lead for Out of School Provision ensure all 7 behavioural and attendance panels are aware of the analysis and recommendations.

- 4.3 Designated Teachers (YJS) are informed about anyone currently on their school roll who has Orders / Interventions that will cease during the next quarter and the week (where known) the Orders / Interventions end. This work to be carried out by a YJS education liaison workers and overseen by the ETE Practice Manager and Head teacher ELAC Virtual School.
- 4.4 Designated Teachers YJS to ensure all those young people on their school roll are offered full time ETE either on school site or at an alternative venue.
- 4.5 Where Designated Teachers YJS are aware a young person known to them has a poor attendance record or has become disengaged and is truanting, a referral should be made to the Education Social Worker. It will be up to the ESW Service to advise further strategies to improve attendance including the possibility of fast track prosecution of parents.
- 4.6 Where a young person has been referred to a Local Behaviour and Attendance panel, the panel through the Chair/Lead for Out of School should be aware of the provision offered. Except for very short term planned integration (for example re-turn from secure estate) full time provision should be offered. There may be cases where this involves 1:1 tuition.
- 4.7 Designated Teachers with multi-agency support should consider if an 'individual timetable' approach is appropriate. In all cases where a young person has provision 'off site' the designated teachers should be aware on a weekly basis of the young person's attendance at all provisions.
- 4.8 Designated Teachers in localities to be aware of opportunities 'off site' for young people and be willing to share information with local authority representatives at Behaviour and Attendance Panels. The quality of provision can then be assessed.
- 4.9 The YJS ETE Practice Manager and Head teacher ELAC Virtual School to liaise with colleagues in the local authority over how to realign the current Learning Skills Council work with those of post compulsory school age to those of compulsory school age in terms of educational opportunities (E2E)
