JSNA Refresh 2010/11

1 Purpose of the Report

- 1.1 To update the NYSP Executive on the Joint Strategic Needs Assessment (JSNA) - progress made in 2009 and the refresh process for 2010/11.

2 Background

- 2.1 The Joint Strategic Needs Assessment (JSNA) looks at the health and well-being within a community, notes the inequalities across communities and is the basis for shaping the commissioning agenda for those commissioners and organisations responsible for shaping the landscape around health and well-being.
- 2.2 North Yorkshire's JSNA was delivered on time. It contained rich data and a strong representation of views of people across North Yorkshire communities. Further work was done to make the County wide document more locally relevant and readable for a wider audience. Geographical editions based on District Council areas were produced and widely distributed. These were welcomed and referred to frequently in other forums

3 Refreshing the JSNA

- 3.1 In refreshing the JSNA partners involved agreed that the way forward was to take a bottom up approach rather than the process be centrally led. Joint letters from North Yorkshire County Council Adult and Community Services and NHS North Yorkshire and York, who are tasked with leading the JSNA process, have been sent to the Local Strategic Partnerships (LSPs) asking for their involvement at a local level with the JSNA. A template that could be used to report local priorities and some guidance notes were also sent with the letter.
- 3.2 Scarborough (North Yorkshire Coast Community Partnership) LSP has returned a completed template. Other LSPs all believe they should be able to give details of local priorities by early January. This work is viewed as part of the local process for refreshing local community planning thus avoiding the need to duplicate any work.
- 3.3 We do not see this involving a major new exercise, as LSPs will already have a good knowledge of their locality. They are likely to have looked at such issues as housing, the drug and alcohol scene, the effects of the economic downturn, the level of needs being expressed in the community etc. They will have taken a view of crime and disorder and what your community's issues

and topics of concern to them are. They may have local events or surveys contributing to picture of place. We have therefore, asked members of the Local Strategic Partnerships to take account of their local JSNA report for 2009 and using the template to give any comments or feedback, they would wish to be considered within the refresh.

3.4 The broad outline of what the refresh will look like is attached at appendix 1

4 Recommendations

4.1 The NYSP Executive is asked to:

- note the proposed way forward in refreshing the Joint Strategic Needs Assessment (JSNA) and
- support the work of LSPs in feeding into the refresh process

Appendix 1 – JSNA Spring 2010 Refresh - Suggested structure and content

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1. Update of quantitative data (annex 3)

- Update existing data sets with latest figures where available.
- Include some (very few) additional data sets where information is now (easily) available.
- Include some forecast information e.g. population projections (More work needs to be done in producing forecasts of future needs but timescales preclude inclusion in the 2010 refresh. Forecasts should be a major addition to the next full JSNA).
- Delete district summaries from start of each outcome section i.e. the spider charts (felt to misleading).

2. Produce a new narrative section

Twenty – thirty pages with four main headings:

- Summarised what services/initiatives are in pace across the county that address some of the key priorities identified in the current JSNA.
- Using the updated data and input from the LSPs, identify the “priority priorities” where there is inequality of service and/or inequality of need in the county.
- Identify two or three “priority priorities” needs for the whole county e.g. the forecast increase in the number of people with dementia.
- Highlight priority needs identified in other North Yorkshire strategic reports and signpost to where further details can be obtained.

3. Distribution

A small number of printed copies of the report will be produced (300?) and will be available for download from the JSNA Web page.
